AKC NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES – BOTH SPECIALTIES

The purpose of the AKC National Owner-Handled Series (NOHS) is to recognize and showcase the quality dogs being exhibited by owner/handlers and to provide a venue for the owner/handlers to compete against their peers. The determination of the awards in the AKC National Owner-Handled Series is based solely on the quality of the entry. The owner/handler's handling ability is not of consideration.



- Dog must be marked as eligible to compete in the AKC NOHS prior to the closing of entries. There is no additional fee to enter this competition.
- Dogs must be handled by an eligible owner/handler for the AKC NOHS throughout the breed level (all classes, Winners, and Best of Breed) competition. Additionally, dogs must be handled by an eligible owner/handler for all AKC National Owner-Handled Series competition.
- Exhibitors must declare their dog AKC National Owner-Handled Series eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form. The handler must be an owner of record according to the AKC's records as of the date of the show. Dogs declared eligible will be identified by an asterisk or other representative mark in the judge's book, steward's book, and the show catalog.
- *Professional handlers, household members and current assistants to professional handlers may not exhibit.
- The Owner-Handled Best of Breed will be selected from the eligible dogs that competed in the Best of Breed/Variety competition. This includes Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, and the undefeated winners of the non-regular classes. This excludes all dogs defeated during class and winners competition.

**Professional handler is defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay within the last five years. Eligibility restrictions apply to all members of the same household. Household members and current assistants to professional handlers in conformation are not eligible to exhibit in this competition. A current assistant is defined as anyone employed by a professional handler on a full-time basis, or assisting a professional handler at the show or any show during the cluster/weekend. Eligibility restrictions apply to all members of the same household.*

2017 NATIONAL FUTURITY STAKE

The purpose of the Futurity Stake is to encourage the breeding of the best possible Bloodhounds and to reward the breeders for their efforts. Thus, the Futurity Stake is weighted towards the breeder. Recognition is also given the owners in whose hands lie the responsibility of developing the inherited potentialities. The Sire is recognized for his genetic contribution.

Puppies are eligible only for the Futurity Stake which occurs in conjunction with the first ABC National Specialty Show held on or after the date that they reach six (6) months of age and are not eligible for subsequent Futurity Stake judging. Champions of record are eligible to compete.

Futurity entrants must also be entered in one of the regular classes at the ABC National Specialty Show. Fee for this class must be paid. Futurity Stake entry must be indicated as an additional entry on the official AKC entry form. The entry fee for Futurity Stake is \$15.00.

Eligible puppies must be breeder, owner or amateur handled during the Futurity judging. Professional handlers will not be allowed to exhibit any dog they do not own or co-own.

Please note: Due to the multiplicity of cash prizes, distribution of these cash prizes will be made at a later time and mailed to the proper recipient.

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches

Puppy, 6 months and under 9 months	Puppy, 9 months and under 12 months
Junior, 12 months and under 15 months	Junior, 15 months and Older

SEQUENCE OF JUDGING

A. The judging sequence for Futurity Stake shall be puppy dog and bitch classes (6-9 & 9-12); Best Futurity Puppy; Best Opposite Sex to Best Futurity Puppy; Junior dog and bitch classes (12-15 & Over 15); Best Futurity Junior; Best Opposite Sex to Best Futurity Junior.

B. Best Futurity Puppy, Best of Opposite Sex to Best Futurity Puppy will be selected from the first place winners from each of the divided puppy classes. Best Futurity Junior and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Futurity Junior will be selected from the first place winners from each of the divided junior classes.

C. The Best Futurity Puppy and the Best Futurity Junior shall compete for Grand Futurity Winner.

D. Eligible puppies must be breeder or owner or amateur handled during the Futurity judging. Professional Handlers will not be allowed to exhibit any dog they do not own or co-own.

DIVISION OF FUTURITY MONIES

A) 80% will be divided equally between the 8 respective classes whether or not there are any entrants for the class. Total prize money for each class will be awarded in the following manner.

- 1) 40% to be awarded to each of the first place winners.
- 2) 30% to be awarded to each of the second place winners.
- 3) 20% to be awarded to each of the third place winners.
- 4) 10% to be awarded to each of the fourth place winners.

- b) 5% will be awarded to the Best Puppy in Futurity.
- c) 3% will be awarded to the Best Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Futurity.
- d) 5% will be awarded to the Best Junior in Futurity.
- e) 3% will be awarded to the Best Opposite Sex to Best Junior in Futurity.
- f) 4% will be awarded to the Grand Prize Futurity Winner.

B. Division of individual prizes.

- a) 50% of the total prize money awarded to an entrant shall go to the breeder(s) of the entrant.
- b) 35% of the total prize money awarded to an entrant shall go to the owner(s) of the entrant.
- c) 15% of the total prize money awarded to an entrant shall go to the owner(s) of the sire at the time of litter nomination provided that the owner of the sire has been a member in good standing of the ABC for at least a twelve month period immediately preceding the date of the Futurity Stake judging. If not, the 15% earmarked for the sire's owner shall revert back to the Total Futurity Stake Monies for division at the next Futurity Stake as outlined in Section 8 of the Futurity Guidelines.

The Veteran Sweepstakes is open to all Bloodhounds who, on the day of the show, will be at least seven years of age or older on the day of the show. There is no restriction on who may handle in Veteran Sweepstakes. Dogs shown in Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in one of the regular classes or at the regular entry fee. Indicate your Veteran Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided. Entrants need not hold a Championship Title. Spayed or Neutered Bloodhounds may also be shown in the Veteran Sweepstakes. There will be no competition between the sexes. Veterans will be Judged BEFORE Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes. **Veteran Sweepstakes entry fee is \$25.00.**

The Veteran Sweepstakes Judge will award First Place only in each class. The First Place Winners in each class will compete for Best Veteran Dog and Best Veteran Bitch.

Dogs shown in Sweepstakes MUST also be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee and on the regular entry form. Indicate your Sweepstakes Class with age division in the space provided for "Additional Classes." First Place Winners of each Puppy Class shall compete for Best Puppy in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Puppy in Sweepstakes. First Place Winners of each Junior Class shall compete for Best Junior in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex to Best Junior in Sweepstakes. The Best Puppy and Best Junior shall compete for Grand Sweepstakes Winner. Champions of record are eligible to compete. **Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes will be Judged AFTER Veteran Sweepstakes. Puppy and Junior Sweepstakes entry fee is \$25.00.**

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches

Puppy Dogs, 6 months and under 9 months
Puppy Dogs, 9 months and under 12 months
Junior, 12 months and under 18 months
Junior, 18 months and under 24 months

Class Cash Prizes will be paid in the ring to the person showing the dog. Claims for prize money must be made in the ring before the judging of that breed is over and the Show Secretary advised at once. The Show Secretary and show-giving Club disclaim any liability for cash prizes after the judging of the breed is over.

Open to dogs and bitches who are at least seven (7) years of age on the day of the event. Spayed or neutered Bloodhounds MAY be shown in the Veteran Non-Regular Class. The two Veteran class winners compete in Best of Breed competition. **Non-Regular Veteran entry fee is \$35.00.**

Working Dogs Working Bitches

Open to AKC Registered Bloodhounds that have been awarded an AKC Tracking Title or an ABC Trailing Title. A minimum of TD or MT respectively is required to enter. Hounds competing in the Working Class will be exhibited in harness. First through Fourth placements will be offered in each sex. The two class winners compete in Best of Breed competition. In accordance with Chapter 11 of Rules Applying to Dog Shows, altered dogs or spayed bitches are ineligible to compete. **Working Dog and Bitch entry fee is \$35.00.**

Best of Breed Competition – The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed (Variety) Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs which according to their owner’s records, have completed the requirements for a championship, but whose championships are unconfirmed. The showing of unconfirmed champions in Best of Breed (Variety) Competition is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship. Selects, if applicable, will be chosen following Best of Breed.

Select Dog Select Bitch

Grand Championship points may be awarded to BOB, BOS and Select Dog and/or Select Bitch. All Dogs chosen for Select must be Champions of Record.

Award of Merit – At the discretion of the judge, 6 Awards of Merit may be given. All those in Best of Breed competition shall be eligible to receive an Award of Merit, except the Best of Breed Winner, the Best of Winners and the Best of Opposite Sex Winner.

Non-Regular Classes (Involving Multiple Dog Entries) –National Specialty Only

Note: Non-regular classes involving multiple entries may be judged before or after Best of Breed. As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

Stud Dog Class and Brood Bitch Class: Each entry is allowed at least two but no more than three get. The merits of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch are not considered in the placement of the entry. It is the quality of the get that forms the basis for the judge's decision. All get must be examined and gaited. The Stud Dog or Brood Bitch must also be examined to determine if there is a condition that would require disqualification or excusal under the Rules, AKC policy or the breed standard. All get must be entered in a regular class in order to be eligible to compete in the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch Class. Handlers of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, and all get being exhibited, must wear armbands. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

Brace Class: Two Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class."

Team Class: Four Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of four handlers. All dogs competing in the team class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Team Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Team is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Team Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Team must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Team Class."

The event-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all Event Service Fees for The American Kennel Club. These

event service and recording fees shall be forwarded to The American Kennel Club along with all other required event results within seven (7) days of the close of the event.

- No Entry will be accepted which specifies any condition as to its acceptance. Telegraph, e-mail and unsigned entries cannot be accepted and will be returned. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE. The Club and/or Baray Events assumes no responsibility for wrong or incomplete information given on the entry blank by the owner or the owner's agent. RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLETENESS OF ENTRY RESTS SOLELY WITH ENTRANT.
- RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY FEE. BaRay Events will add a \$30.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check. We will not re-process checks. JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

NOVICE AND OPEN CLASS DIVIDED: **Junior**-9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show; **Intermediate**-12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show; **Senior**-15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

SCHEDULE OF POINTS - EFFECTIVE MAY 17, 2017

For complete Conformation Championship requirements see **Chapter 16** of the *Rules Applying to Dog Shows*. The Points toward a Championship shall be awarded to the Winners Dog and Bitch of each breed or variety based on the actual number of dogs or bitches competing in that breed or variety.

If the dog designated Winners Dog or Winners Bitch is also awarded Best of Breed or Variety, the dogs of both sexes that have been entered for Best of Breed or Variety competition and that have been defeated in such competition, shall be counted in addition to the dogs that completed in the regular classes for its sex in calculating championship points.

If the dog designated Winners Dog or Winners Bitch is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed or Variety, the dogs of its own sex that have been entered for Best of Breed or Variety competition that have been defeated in competition for Best of Opposite Sex, shall be counted in addition to the dogs that completed in the regular classes for its sex in calculating championship points.

After points have been computed for Winners Dog and Winners Bitch subject to the above two stipulations, the dog awarded the Best of Winners shall be credited with the number of points calculated for Winners Dog or Winners Bitch, whichever is greater.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, or that is dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge, or from which all awards are withheld shall not be included. Any dog which shall have won fifteen points shall become a Champion of Record, if six or more of said points shall have been won at two shows with a rating of three or more championship points each and under two different judges, and some one or more of the balance of said points shall have been won under some other judge or judges than the two judges referred to above.
