Note: Compact rooms do NOT have an Ocean View and are TINY.. BUT the rest open up to the Beach. There is a onetime cleaning fee of \$25 for dogs in rooms. Resort fee is waived. Local lodging tax is currently 11.5% (subject to change).

The Hotel will allow up to 3 dogs per room (of any breed). There is a onetime cleaning fee of \$25 per room with pets that will be charged at check-in. The hotel will have access to the room at least once a day to prevent any cumulative damage. Dogs must be crated at all times while in a guest room. Appropriate measures must be taken to protect the carpet and surrounding areas under and near the crate. The guest agrees to take full financial liability for all damages by the pet including but not limited to: odor, damaging furniture or any part of the room, urination, etc. This includes other parts of the hotel where the dog may have to pass through to get to the rooms, i.e., the hallways and elevators. The room is to be inspected by a hotel associate and a designated member of the Show Committee before checking out.

Chinook Winds Casino has a total of 39 dry camping RV spots on the Casino Premises reserved for the SBCA during the Week of the National.

• Cost will be \$25.00 per day for reserved parking space.

Notice: This is dry camping only. Electricity, water, and Sewer will not be provided. No dumping of gray or black water. We are still working on getting a Honey Truck to come once during the week to empty tanks. Cost and payment will be given to the company by each resident for their services on an individual basis if you choose to use them. We are not taking reservations for this service.

Parking Rules

- Motorhomes and Travel Trailer Parking Only No open fires, including campfires. No dumping of gray water. This is a dry-camp area only.
- No generators running after 10pm. No tents. All pets must be on a leash at all times. Please clean up after your pet. No firearms, BB guns, fireworks, or other weapons allowed. Trash cans provided are for household garbage only (and bagged dog poop). Children must be supervised at all times. Parents are responsible for their children's safe conduct and any injuries or damage that that may incur or cause. Unsupervised children who cause disruption for other guests may cause their group to be asked to leave the property.
- The following restriction apply to overnight parking of RVs. The Overnight RV placard (Supplied by CWCR) Must be placed on the driver's side of the dashboard. RV's may not block lanes of traffic, create a nuisance or park in a manner that creates a safety on public hazard. The overnight RV Parking Permit shall not exempt vehicles from complying with any parking regulation including the following restrictions: Handicapped Zones, "Tow Away" Zones, Fire Hydrants, Red Curb for Bus Zones, Passenger Loading Zones, Commercial Loading Zones, Temporary Parking or No Stopping Restrictions. Please Adhere to all posted Regulations.

IMPORTANT: It shall be the responsibility of the registrant/vehicle operator to understand these restrictions, to read the posted signs, and to ensure adherence. Compliance with these restrictions is essential to the orderly and safe movement of both pedestrians and vehicles. Failure to do so may result in the revocation of the parking placard. Revocation resulting from the improper use of the failure to display the parking placard will be upheld.

We have contracted with the tenting company to provide Staked Grooming tents in two different sizes with three walls.

To rent a 10 x 10 solid grooming tent cost will be \$235 for the week. To rent a 10 x 20 solid tent cost will be \$365 for the week. **You must order before August 1, 2018** (or until they are sold out) to secure a tent. AKC CANINE GOOD CITIZEN(CGC)

The Saint Bernard Rescue Foundation is sponsoring CGC Testing. Testing will be available on Tuesday at noon by AKC Approved Evaluators

The Canine Good Citizen Program is a two-part program. First, to teach responsible dog ownership to owners and second, to certify that dogs have the training and behaviors needed to be reliable. The CGC tests are noncompetitive. Dogs are not required to perform items on the test with the same precision needed in formal obedience trials. There are 10 elements for the dog to pass on the CGC Test:

- Accepting a Friendly Stranger
- Sitting Politely for Petting
- Appearance and Grooming
- Out for a walk on a loose lead
- Walking through a Crowd
- Sit and Down on Command
- Staying in Place
- Coming When Called
- Reaction to Another Dog
- Reaction to Distractions
- Supervised Separation.

You no longer need a rabies certificate or immunization record for the CGC tests. You will be asked to sign a pledge that your dog is current on his vaccinations. CGC Testing may be done on a 6-foot lead with a buckle or slip collar or body harness. Head and pinch collars are not allowed. Dogs can be any age to be tested. Fees for CGC tests are \$15 per test. Testing will be scheduled at 15-minute intervals.

AWARD OF MERIT

All Saints eligible for the Best of Breed class, except those awarded Best-Of-Breed, Best-Of-Opposite-Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch are eligible to be given an "Award-Of-Merit" (AOM) subject to the following restrictions (see show manual for others):

The maximum number of AOM's that may be awarded shall be ten (10%) percent of the total number of entries in the Best of Breed class, INCLUDING Winners Dog and Winners Bitch, Veteran class winners, Working Dog winner, Working Bitch winner, and those dogs moved up to Breed per AKC rules. In calculating the maximum number of AOM's allowable under the 10% rule, any fractional number shall be rounded off to the next highest whole number.

The judge may withhold any or all of the AOM's for lack of merit.

Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, Select Dog and Select Bitch are NOT eligible for AOM, however both Winners Dog and Winners Bitch are eligible for AOM.

BEST PUPPY IN SHOW COMPETITION

Best Puppy – First place winners in Puppy Classes, 6 mos. and under 9 mos. and 9 mos. and under 12 mos., both sexes will compete together and will be judged after Best of Breed.

BEST BRED BY EXHIBITOR IN SHOW COMPETITION

Best in Bred by Exhibitor – First place winners in the Bred by Exhibitor Classes will be judged together, to be judged after Best in Puppy Classes which will be judged after Best of Breed.

BEST VETERAN IN SHOW COMPETITION

Best Veteran – First place winners in Veterans Classes both sexes will compete together and will be judged after Best Bred by Exhibitor in Show after Best of Breed.

(note - Novice Classes not offered)

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

Veteran Dogs, 7 yrs. & older Veteran Bitches, 7 yrs. & older

Each Veteran Class Winner is eligible for Best of Breed Competition, provided they have not been defeated in any other single entry class. Ch. 11, Sec. 8, neutered dogs & spayed bitches will be allowed to compete in Veteran Classes.

Working Dogs Working Bitches

For dogs/bitches that have at least one SBCA Working Dog Title in Weight Pull or Draft Dogs. Note: Dogs and Bitches do not need to be Champions of Record for the Working Dog or Working Bitch Classes. Obedience Titles do not qualify for this class nor do neutered dogs or spayed bitches. Dogs and Bitches must not have any condition that would disqualify them from being in any AKC All-Breed or Specialty show in the regular classes. A dog that has been defeated by a dog of its own sex in any regular or non-regular class for single dog entries in its breed at the show is ineligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed. (AKC Rules Applying to Dog Show, Ch. 11, Sec. 13)

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

Note: Non-regular classes involving multiple entries may be judged before or after Best of Breed. As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

Stud Dog Class and Brood Bitch Class: Each entry is allowed two or more get. The merits of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch are not considered in the placement of the entry. It is the quality of the get that forms the basis for the judge's decision. All get must be examined and gaited. The Stud Dog or Brood Bitch must also be examined to determine if there is a condition that would require disqualification or excusal under the Rules, AKC policy or the breed standard. All get must be entered in a regular class in order to be eligible to compete in the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch Class. Handlers of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, and all get being exhibited, must wear armbands. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

***Brace Class:** Two Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class."

**Entrants in Brace MUST include the name(s) and registration number(s) of all brace/team members, or the entry may be rejected. If entering online, send an email to the office with the information, including the name of the show.*

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

NOVICE CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

NOVICE AND OPEN CLASS DIVIDED: **Junior**-9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show; **Intermediate**-12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show; **Senior**-15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

After the judge has awarded the Best Junior Handler, the second place winner from the class that the Junior was awarded Best Junior Handler is to return to the ring to compete for Reserve Best Junior Handler.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department, 919-233-9767. BE SURE ALL INFORMATION for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of entry form.

NOTE: SUBSTITUTION OF DOG IN JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP AT THE SHOW(S): There will be an Administration Fee of \$5.00 charged for any substitution of dog in Junior Showmanship at each show. In addition, if the dog originally entered in Jr. Showmanship was an additional entry, and the dog being substituted is not otherwise entered in the show, the Junior Showmanship Only fee applies.

PEE WEE SPECIAL ATTRACTION – SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 2018

Geared for children ages 5-9: Each Pee Wee unit consists of the child, their responsible adult, and the dog. Only one Pee Wee unit is in the ring at a time. This is not a competitive class, but rather a fun, learning experience for the child and the adult. • A dog must be at least four months of age to enter the Pee Wee class. • All dogs entered must have the proper lead and collar. • A responsible adult must be present with the child both inside and outside the ring. The adult is to maintain control of the dog outside of the ring. • Dogs that are allowed: Saint Bernards only • A release must be signed by the child's parent or legal guardian. Pee Wee Release of Liability will be available at the show. A time and ring will be listed in the judging program. • The entry fee has been waived by the club. There is no cost for this event. Entries will be accepted on the day of the event.

• The safety of the dog and child inside and outside the ring is a primary concern. Outside of the ring, the dog is to be controlled by the adult accompanying the child. At the Judge's discretion based upon the size of the child and the dog, for safety purposes the adult may be asked to attach a second lead to the dog so both child and adult will walk the dog together. Although the word "judge" will be used, this is designed to be a learning and mentoring experience. No PeeWee will be "judged", but rather will be mentored with the age-appropriate amount of information to help prepare them for what they will be expected to know about AKC regular Junior Showmanship once they reach 9 years of age. The children will be mentored one child, their adult, and dog in the ring at a time. Each child will receive a participation ribbon and a prize to commemorate the experience. There is no pre-entry, but we would like to know the number of Pee Wee Participants to expect. Please send an email with the participant's name and adult's name by **August 31, 2018**. Entries not on Official AKC Entry Forms and Photocopies of Entry Forms without Agreement and Rules on reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE.
