- Any exhibitor's entries may be refused for previous misuse of the hotel facilities. This is an AKC supported measure.
- There will be a one-time nonrefundable pet fee in the amount of \$75.00 per room. Cash
 paying guests MUST PROVIDE A CREDIT CARD AT TIME OF ARRIVAL, AND CASH CAN BE USED
 AT CHECKOUT AFTER ROOM IS INSPECTED FOR DAMAGES.
- The hotel reserves the right to request that dogs be removed from the room when cleaned. Use strainer when bathing pets in guest room.
- Dogs must be crated when left alone in the room. Dogs shall not be allowed to run free in your room while you are gone, nor may you confine them in the bathroom. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- Place plastic sheeting under all crates, X-Pens and other equipment for confining your dog(s).
- Do not use hotel towels for dog grooming. There is a \$25.00 fee for using hotel towels.

AKC NATIONAL OWNER-HANDLED SERIES - ALL THREE SPECIALTIES

This is a non-titling competition for dogs that are exhibited by their owners that are not professional handlers. All dogs that are owner-handled and are not solely owned or exhibited by professional handlers* meet the requirements for this competition. Exhibitors must declare their dog is Owner-Handled eligible at the time of entry using the check box on the entry form. Eligible dogs will be identified by an asterisk in the judge's book, steward's book & the catalog.

Dogs must be handled throughout the breed level competition for the regular show by an eligible owner*. Professional handlers, household members and assistants to current professional handlers may not exhibit the dog in any breed competition during the entire show.

*Professional handlers are defined as any person who belongs or has belonged to a professional handlers' organization, distributed rate cards, or otherwise advertised or represented themselves as handling dogs for pay or received payment for handling a dog within the last five years.

Entries into the Amateur-Owner-Handler class are automatically entered into the AKC NOHS and do not have to check the box on the entry form.

Spayed and neutered animals may be entered and shown in Veteran Classes at specialty shows. Winners of the Veterans Classes may also compete for Best of Breed Competition, provided that they are undefeated in any Regular Class at this show.

Non-Regular Classes (Involving multiple dog entries)

Note: Non-regular classes involving multiple entries may be judged before or after Best of Breed. As the judge's decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog, no one of the dogs making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed by virtue of having won the class.

Stud Dog Class and Brood Bitch Class: Each entry is allowed a minimum of two and no more than six of their Get. The merits of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch are not considered in the placement of the entry. It is the quality of the get that forms the basis for the judge's decision. All get must be examined and gaited. The Stud Dog or Brood Bitch must also be examined to determine if there is a condition that would require disqualification or excusal under the Rules, AKC policy or the breed standard. All get must be entered in a regular class in order to be eligible to compete in the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch Class. Handlers of the Stud Dog or Brood Bitch, and all get being exhibited, must wear armbands. Ch. 11, Sec. 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class."

Brace Class: Two Dogs, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in the brace class must have at least one common owner. Dogs do not need to be entered in any other class. Dogs comprising a Brace Class must be named at the time of entry, and full particulars must be given for each dog on individual entry forms. If a dog which is to be part of a Brace is not entered in another class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as part of a Brace must be marked accordingly in the space provided for additional classes as "Brace Class."

BEST PUPPY FROM THE REGULAR PUPPY CLASSES

Best Puppy from the Regular Puppy Classes will be awarded from the First Place winners in the Regular Puppy Classes (6-9 & 9-12) ONLY immediately following each breed. If the Best of Breed or Best of Winners is awarded to a dog/bitch coming from the Regular Puppy Classes (6-9 & 9-12), the Best Puppy from the Regular Puppy Classes win is automatic.

BEST BRED BY EXHIBITOR

Best Bred By Exhibitor will be awarded from the First Place winners in the Bred By Exhibitor Classes ONLY immediately following each breed. If the Best of Breed or Best of Winners is awarded to a dog/bitch coming from the Bred By Exhibitor Class for that breed, the Best Bred By Exhibitor win is automatic.

Separate Entry Fees for each dog, each day.

Entry Fees for Conformation include 50 cents AKC Recording Fee. If the same dog is entered in more than one class, the highest priced class shall be considered the first entry.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class. A first place in Novice without competition leading to a Best Junior award with competition would count as one win towards moving to Open at a licensed or member show.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class or if a win in Novice leads to a Best Junior with competition present it will count as one win towards moving to Open in a licensed or member show. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have 10 Best Junior wins with competition. The calendar for this class will be consistent with the eligibility dates for the AKC National Championship. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed. Once the eligibility time frame for that year has passed all participants return to the Open Class to compete for the following year.

FUTURITY/MATURITY ELIGIBILITY

Futurity Eligibility: The nomination of a litter is open to anyone who breeds a litter of Lhasa Apsos. A litter nomination must be made within 90 days of birth. By nomination of the litter, all dogs in that litter are eligible to enter the Futurity, regardless of ownership change. Litters born between April 1, 2018 and ending March 31, 2019, (or August 15, 2019, with payment of penalty for late nomination) and nominated are eligible to show in the Futurity. Nomination fee is \$20.00 per futurity litter. Entries after 90 days of birth will be accepted with a late fee until August 31st of the year of the futurity. Late fee schedule will be as follows: 1-30 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$15, 31-60 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$25, 61-90 days late - initial \$20 nominating fee + additional \$40. Absolute deadline is Aug 31st before the National of that year. Maximum number of days late = 180 days (6 months of age).

Futurity Entries: All dogs entered in the Futurity/Maturity MUST also be entered in one or more of the regular classes at the ALAC National Specialty. The entry for the Futurity/Maturity class MUST be made on the same entry form. The entry form must be marked in the Additional Class section with the word "FUTURITY OR MATURITY" and the ASSIGNED FUTURITY/MATURITY NUMBER. The entry fee of \$25 for the Futurity/Maturity class must accompany the fee for the regular class. Entries without a Futurity/ Maturity litter number are not acceptable for competition.

This year's MATURITY eligible Lhasas: All Lhasas from litters nominated for the 2018 Futurity are eligible for the 2019 Maturity, dogs MUST BE nominated by their owners and include the Futurity litter number from 2018. All puppies from a futurity-nominated litter are eligible for the Maturity the following year and will receive their own Maturity number *provided the owner nominates the dog*.

 or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open, or to complete the Show NO

- Please note: Any hotel or motel listed in the premium list is subject to Event Committee Rules. We expect our
 exhibitors to be responsible guests. A report that an exhibitor at this show has abused hotel or motel property
 during this weekend may result in disciplinary action. Clubs reserve the right to decline future entries from the
 offending party in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 11, Section 15 of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows.
- Dogs need be present only for scheduled judging and will be released if not needed for further judging. Dogs
 must be ready for judging. Neither the club nor its Superintendent will be responsible or obligated to furnish any
 service for notifying exhibitors or their agents of Breed or Class Judging. Judges need not wait for any dog holding
 up a class. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging rings.
- Only dogs eligible for these shows will be admitted into the show area. There is no provision for unentered dogs.
 LOSS OR DAMAGE The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors,
- but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of any accident or misfortune, to either dogs or exhibitors participating in these Shows. The welfare of an Exhibitor's child is assumed to be the responsibility of the Exhibitor. It is distinctly understood that Exhibitors will exercise control and restraint over their children.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external
 parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. Additionally, clubs should include any
 specific local health requirements; for example proof of rabies vaccination.
- PUBLICATION RIGHTS By entering this show, all owners, handlers, breeders and kennels agree that all rights to televise, videotape, photograph, advertise, promote and publicize or otherwise exploit this show, or the persons or animals participating in it or the results of the competition before, during or after the event, shall belong solely to The American Kennel Club and their respective assigns, including the use of the names, likenesses or biographical matter of all dogs, owners, handlers, breeders and kennels participating in the show and no such owner, handler, breeder or kennel shall allow any other party to make commercial use of any videotape or photograph of any person or animal participating in this competition.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- \bullet Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- · Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- · Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
