RACING CLASS: Must have achieved one of the following titles: ARX, R.CH, WRCH, ORC

LURE COURSING CLASS: Must have earned ASFA FCh or AKC FC.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES, INVOLVING MULTIPLE ENTRIES

As the judge's decision in the following classes is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won in these classes.

- STUD DOG CLASS: For dogs that have sired two dogs or bitches entered in this show. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy, or the standard for its breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed competition, or some other non-regular class. The Stud Dog MUST BE PRESENT IN THE RING.
- **BROOD BITCH CLASS:** For bitches that have whelped two dogs or bitches entered in this show. The owner of the Brood Bitch need not necessarily be owner of the Produce. While the merits of the Brood Bitch are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Brood Bitch must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy, or the standard for its breed. **The Brood Bitch MUST BE PRESENT IN THE RING.**
- **EXTENDED GENERATIONS STUD DOG CLASS:** Their Get, one of their Get's Get, and if desired, one of their Get's Get. Class must be comprised of a minimum of three successive generations and a maximum of four successive generations with a total entry of no more than three (3) get. Owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of the Get. **The Stud Dog and Get MUST BE PRESENT IN THE RING**.
- **EXTENDED GENERATIONS BROOD BITCH CLASS:** Same as Extended Generations Stud Dog Class except substitute (Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.)
- BRACE CLASS: Two dogs that are similar in appearance, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in brace competition must have at least one common owner. The Dogs comprising a Brace MUST be named at the time of entry. Entry fee for Brace Class as a UNIT is \$25.00. In making entries for "Brace Class Only" full particulars MUST be given for each dog on individual entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in a Regular Class or for "Best of Breed Competition" and entered as part of a Brace MUST be marked accordingly in the space provided for Additional Classes, "Brace Class." If more than one Brace is entered by same owner, dogs comprising EACH BRACE must be designated "Brace No. 1." Brace No. 2." etc.
- **TEAM CLASS:** A TEAM is defined at four of the same recognized breed or variety that are similar in appearance, performing in unison and presented by a maximum of four handlers. FUTURITY RIBBON PRIZES

FUTURITY NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS & RULES

- The Futurity is sponsored by the American Whippet Club and is exclusively for the competition
 of puppies and juniors between 6 months and 18 months of age.
- The Futurity is open to all breeders of AKC registered whippets in good standing with the American Kennel Club and the American Whippet Club.
- Puppies eligible for the 2011 Futurity must be out of Futurity nominated bitches and whelped from October 21, 2009 through October 5, 2010.
- The bitch must be nominated prior to whelping. The official Bitch Nomination Form, along with
 the fee of \$20 and copies of current CERF certificates for both the sire and dam, must be sent
 to the Futurity Chairman and postmarked prior to the whelping date.
- CERF exams for both the sire and dam must have been completed before the breeding date.
 (This is effective starting with the 2012 Futurity). Copies of CERF Certificates or a copy of the application for a CERF Certificate (the actual exam paperwork marked normal in both eyes) must be submitted for both the sire and dam with the Bitch Nomination Form. CERF examinations are valid for one year.
- If the sire or dam of the litter being nominated is 10 years of age or older, a current CERF exam
 is not required for that dog. HOWEVER, the dog must have had and passed at least one CERF
 exam between the ages of 8 and 10 years. A copy of the last CERF Certificate must be submitted
 with the Bitch Nomination Form.
- Late bitch nominations are accepted if they are postmarked prior to the litter turning 6 weeks old. The fee for a late nomination is \$75. Breeders of late nominated bitches waive their right to nominate and vote for the Futurity Judge.
- The official Litter Nomination Form, along with the fee of \$25 and a four-generation pedigree, must be postmarked prior to the litter turning 3 months old.
- To enter the Futurity, puppies must be entered in a Regular Conformation Class and the appropriate Futurity Class as an 'additional' class at the AWC National they were nominated and are eligible for.
- Puppies are only eligible to be shown in one Futurity; the first Futurity that they are at least 6
 months of age.
- Futurity Classes will be divided according to age and sex as follows:

Dogs 6-8 months
Dogs 8-10 months
Dogs 10-12 Months
Dogs 12-14 Months
Dogs 14-18 Months
Dogs 14-18 Months
Dogs 14-18 Months

- The winner of each class will compete for Best In Futurity.
- In the event that the date of the AWC National is later in April than the previous year, the age limit shall be increased and the nominees affected shall be eligible for competition in the 14-18 Month classes
- The Futurity Judge is chosen by a two-step process by breeders of nominated bitches who are members in good standing of the American Whippet Club.
- Step 1: Ballots are sent to the First AWC Member listed as breeder on the Bitch Nomination Form. For each nominated bitch, the breeder/or breeders may submit one slate of two names. One ballot will be accepted for each bitch nominated. Once those breeders have voted (nominated), they may not vote (nominate) again during the current year. It is up to the breeder(s) to decide which litter they wish to be considered eligible on if they are listed as a breeder or co-breeder on other litters. All eligible breeders must nominate two (2) different names of any person with the qualification of "hands on experience" with the Whippet breed. These people must be in good standing with the AKC.

- Step 2: Ballots are again sent to the First AWC Member listed as breeder on the Bitch Nomination
 Form. The breeder/or breeders will select two (2) names from the final list of a minimum of
 six (6) names. The nominees will be queried as to their willingness to judge the event by
 the sequence established in the balloting process. The alternate Judge will be selected by the
 second greatest number of votes. The nominee who accepts this nomination will be assigned
 as an alternate..
- "Late" bitch nominations forfeit their right to ballot for the Futurity Judge.
- Prize Money 35% of entry & nomination fees will be retained by the Futurity for expenses. 35% of the remainder will be given to the Best In Futurity winner. The remainder will be divided as follows: 40% for First Place, 30% for Second Place, 20% for Third Place and 10% for Fourth Place. Prize money shall be awarded to the breeder/breeders only. If an owner or exhibitor of the winning dog is not the breeder, and the breeder is not present, a check will be mailed directly to the breeder. It is between the breeders, exhibitors and owners to decide possession of any awards or cash prizes presented for any wins.
- Entry fees will be retained in the event a nominated bitch or puppy is found to be ineligible under any of the above conditions.

RULES AND INFORMATION FOR ALL OWNERS:

- There is no age limit for dogs taking the CGC test. The exception to this is that with any AKC event they must be at least 6 months of age.
- All tests must be performed on leash. Dogs should wear well-fitting buckle or slip collars (including martingales) made of leather, fabric, or chain. Special training equipment such as harnesses, pinch collars and head collars are not permitted.
- Dogs with disabilities such as the loss of a leg, deafness, or blindness in one eye are welcome
 in the Canine Good Citizen Test.

The 10 test items are:

- ITEM 1: ACCEPTING A FRIENDLY STRANGER
- ITEM 2: SITTING POLITELY FOR PETTING

- ITEM 6: SIT AND DOWN ON COMMAND/STAYING IN PLACE

- ITEM 8: REACTION TO ANOTHER DOG
- ITEM 9: REACTION TO DISTRACTIONS
- ITEM 10: SUPERVISED SEPARATION

17th Annual AWC Triathlon

The AWC Triathlon competition was developed to recognize whippets that excel in three areas of competition: conformation, lure coursing and obedience. The 17th annual competition is open to all whippets entered in eligible Conformation, Obedience and Lure Coursing Stakes at the 2011 AWC National Specialty in Lexington, KY. To acknowledge the dogs that excel in all three areas of competition, there will be 10 placement awards.

Triathlon Trophies

First Place in Triathlon: 10 -inch commemorative plate.

First Place in Triathlon: Betty Crawford Memorial – Bronze Medallion offered by Mary Alderman.

Second through Tenth Place: 8-inch commemorative plate.

First through Tenth Place: Two-tone martingale collar and lead with a brass plate on the collar with placement engraved. Designed by Bolduc Leather and offered by Cora Miller of Hound Hill Whippets.

First through Tenth Place: Rosette.

2011 AWC National Triathlon Rules and Scoring

The total raw scores for all three events will be added together. At the completion of all three events, the dog with the highest point total will be declared the 2011 Triathlon Champion.

Conformation: The base score for conformation is determined by the judge in the Triathlon conformation class. A numeric score will be given utilizing a Conformation Score Sheet based on the breed standard having a perfect score of 100. The 4 top scoring dogs will be ranked first through fourth place. The high scoring dog will be High Score in Conformation (HCS). This is not an actual award but is utilized in the case of breaking ties as listed below. Upon receipt of your entry form, entry into the Triathlon Conformation class is automatic. This year's conformation judge will be Dr A. Todd Miller. Handlers with multiple dogs will need to find helpers to bring their dogs into the ring initially and for a final class evaluation at the end. Otherwise, you may handle each dog during the individual inspection.

Lure Coursing: The ASFA trial that will be held on Sunday, April 3rd, is the official AWC trial and should be used in the Triathlon. The base score for lure coursing is the total final score of points. **Obedience:** The base score for obedience is the highest total points earned in any single-dog entry Obedience trial class. NOTE: Non-qualifying scores are utilized in calculating the total score. The base score for obedience is a perfect score of 200 points. Only one obedience class will count toward the final triathlon score and that class must be declared on the entry form below. For example, if you are entering a dog in the Veteran Class and Novice B class, you can only count one score for your obedience points. You cannot participate in both events and choose the highest score. Rather, you must declare the class to be scored for Triathlon on your entry form and this will be the only score used for this portion of the event.

Bonus Points

There will be no Bonus Points awarded for placements. The total of the raw scores will be used. In the case of a tie, placements will be utilized for tie breaker points. Placements will be given points of 4, 3, 2, and 1 for First through Fourth place in a four-dog or more class. Only 1 point will be awarded for a one-dog class, 2 points and 1 point for a two-dog class, and 3 points, 2 points, and 1

point for a three-dog class. BIF, HIT and HCS will be utilized as final tiebreakers in that order, used only after all placement tie-breaker points have been awarded. To qualify for triathlon placements, dogs must compete in all three events. If a dog does not compete in an event or receives a 0 score from an event, they are automatically disqualified from the Triathlon. The triathlon competition is designed to reward dogs who compete in and receive scores in all three events. To this end, the top 10 awards will reflect the spirit of the competition.

TRIATHLON ENTRY FORM

The Triathlon Chairman will handle the automatic entry in the Triathlon Conformation Class. Entries in any regular Conformation, Obedience or Lure trial stake are the responsibility of the owner.

AWC VERSATILITY COMPETITION

The AWC Versatility Competition was developed to recognize whippets that excel in four areas of competition: conformation, lure coursing, rally, and agility. The competition is open to all whippets entered in eligible conformation, rally, agility classes, and lure trial stakes offered at the 2011 AWC National Specialty in Lexington, Kentucky. Teams may enter both the Triathlon and the Versatility Competition.

Versatility Trophies

First Place in Versatility: Large Rosette and Silver Photo Album (The Calvin Prize)

Second through Tenth Place: Rosette

The Calvin Prize is awarded annually to the winner of the Versatility Competition in honor of BIF, DC, UGRCH, UAGII, UCD Appraxin Callaban Kristobel, CD, MC, LCM3, V-FCH, NA, NAJ, OJP, NAP, CGC, CAVX by Fred and Bobbie Lutz. It is a silver photo album with space for the winner to engrave their dog's name.

2011 AWC National Versatility Competition Rules and Scoring

Teams will be given ranks based on their scores in the respective competitions. The ranks will be averaged with the lowest total average winning.

Conformation: The raw score for conformation is determined by the judge in the Versatility conformation class. A raw score will be given utilizing the same Conformation Score Sheet utilized in the triathlon. Dogs will be ranked according to the raw score received. This year's conformation judge will be Dr A. Todd Miller. Handlers with multiple dogs will need to find helpers to bring their dogs into the ring initially and for a final class evaluation at the end. Otherwise, you may handle each dog during the individual inspection.

Lure Coursing: Dogs will be ranked based on their total raw score regardless of stake entered with the versatility competition dog getting the highest score receiving a rank of 1, the second highest score receiving a rank of 2, and so on until all competitors are ranked.

Rally: Dogs that qualify will be ranked according to their class and then their raw score. Qualifying dogs competing in Rally Excellent A and B will be ranked first, then qualifying dogs in Rally Advanced A and B, and finally dogs in Rally Novice A and B. Non-qualifying dogs will be ranked by class with all NQ dogs in the same class receiving the same rank. Dogs that compete in both Rally Advanced and Rally Excellent must declare which class they want scored on their entry form; only ONE class is allowed for scoring and must be declared at the time of entry.

Agility: Dogs must enter both the Standard and Jumpers classes. Qualifying dogs will be ranked in the same manner as rally according to class (Excellent, Open, Novice, in that order) and then raw score. Non-qualifying dogs will also be ranked as in rally. Dogs entering preferred classes will be scored in the corresponding class (Excellent, Open, Novice.) However, dogs that normally run in regular classes many not enter a preferred class solely for the purposes of this competition. The raw scores from the Standard and JWW classes will be added together and divided by 2 to get a final agility ranking.

Ties: For tie scores, each dog will receive the same rank with the next highest scoring dog receiving a lower rank depending on how many dogs tie. For example, if dog A and dog B receive a score of 285 and dog C receives a 283, dog A and B would receive a rank of 1 and dog C would receive a rank of 3.

Overall Placement: The ranks from lure coursing, rally, agility, and conformation will be added together and divided by 4 to receive the final score for overall placements. In the case of ties, raw scores will be used in this order: Lure Coursing, Conformation, Agility, and Rally.

All dogs must be handled by their owner in all sports (including conformation).

VERSATILITY COMPETITION ENTRY FORM

The Versatility Competition Chairman will handle the automatic entry in the Versatility Conformation Class. Entries in any regular conformation, rally and agility class and lure coursing stakes are the responsibility of the owner. Dogs must compete in all their events.

NATIONAL SPECIALTY SHOW HOTEL RULES

The following rules have been established for the good of all exhibitors concerned.

- 1. Plastic sheeting to be placed under every crate in your hotel rooms. This will keep carpets clean and dry. Plastic sheeting for each crate will be made available upon check in.
- DOGS MUST BE CRATED WHEN THE OWNER/HANDLER IS OUT OF THE ROOM!! NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 3. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times while in the hotel or on the hotel grounds. Rooms must be kept clean of dog debris. NO DOGS ALLOWED IN LOBBY AREA.
- Dogs should be exercised in designated areas on the hotel premises. EVERY DOG OWNER is expected to pick up after his/her own dog(s) and dispose of the waste in nearby trashcans.
- 5. NO DOG MAY BE BATHED IN THE HOTEL.
- Rooms will be inspected **daily** by members of the hotel staff and observed violations or damages will be reported to the hotel management and/or the Investigating Committee. Do not Disturb signs will not be honored for the entire day by the hotel staff.
- The Investigating Committee, working with a fair and equitable system, is in charge of investigating complaints.
- 8. Each dog owner/registrant is expected to cooperate with the Investigating Committee, hopefully settling damage claims on the spot, or must be willing to furnish information such as insurance policy numbers and other pertinent information required.
- Should the hotel, for cause, deem it necessary to cancel room privileges, the registrant agrees
 to forego legal action against the AWC and it's committees, the host club, and or the hotel.
 This is a condition of entry to the National Specialty.
- 10. As an exhibitor, be aware that violations may also be referred to the Bench Show Committee if written charges are preferred. If the Bench Show Committee upholds such charges, it may lead to suspension from future show privileges. Charges may also be filed with the AWC, which may lead to expulsion from the Club unless fair and equitable claims are satisfied.
- 11. Exercise pens will be allowed only in designated areas.
- 12. If you are leaving the hotel property and are leaving dogs crated in your room, please arrange with another exhibitor who is remaining at the show site to be responsible for your dogs during your absence in case of a problem or emergency. When leaving, provide the front desk with the name and room number (or which RV) where the person who is responsible for your dogs during your absence can be contacted. (Leaving your cell phone number is advisable)

When moving into your hotel room, check it carefully. If you find that there are problems or damage from a prior guest, call the front desk. This could save you any problems should this damage have gone undetected before you check in.

Important Reminders: It is very important that we all do our best to maintain cleanliness with our dogs at our hotel. There will be designated areas for exercising your dog(s). Don't wait too long to get them out. Go to the shortest route; take baggies with you in case of an accident. Do not walk away from your dog's mess. Demand others to clean up after their dogs. Please report someone who is not observing the rules. You may help us in the future to get another hotel! Bench Show Committee Meeting and Hearing will be called on anyone who abuses our hotel. The AKC will back us if we have a problem. Inform any of the following people: Cindy Scott, Jan Swayze-Curry or Rhonda Gifford if you notice a problem. Please remember to use the plastic sheeting under your crates. Bedspreads will be removed from rooms where dogs are to be kept. Please leave all other pets at home as they will not be allowed on hotel property – yes that includes being kept in your vehicle. NO other breeds allowed in the ballroom during judging.

#### WHIPPET HEALTH FOUNDATION - HEALTH CLINICS - 2011

The Whippet Health Foundation will be conducting health clinics in conjunction with the 2011 AWC National Specialty. CERF, BAER and cardiac echocardiogram clinics will be held as well as AKC DNA Profile and Myostatin deficiency testing. The Whippet Health Foundation will be subsidizing a portion of the per dog cost for BAER, cardiac, and myostatin testing for those dogs participating in the WHF database. In addition, this year we will be acquiring blood samples for a WHF-subsidized thyroid study that will determine normal thyroid values for our breed. Please see below. All test results subsidized by and released to the WHF Database will be public record.

#### HEALTH CLINIC SCHEDULE AT THE 2011 AWC NATIONAL

**Eye Clinic: Wednesday, April 6th.** This clinic will be conducted by Dr. Erica Tolar, DVM, ACVO. The cost is \$30 per dog. The CERF (**C**anine **Eye Registration Foundation**) exam is a yearly test that examines your dog's eyes for inherited eye disease. The exam will require pupil dilation and takes approximately 15 to 20 minutes. This test is required for all sires and dams of futurity nominated litters. The clinic will run from 9AM until finished.

BAER Hearing Clinic: Tuesday morning, April 5th. This clinic will be conducted by Dr. Susanne Hughes. The cost is \$45 per dog. The BAER (Brain stem Auditory Evoked Response) test is a once per lifetime test to definitively determine if your dog can hear from both ears. The test usually takes 10-15 minutes and sedation is not necessary. If you are willing to enter both your dog and the BAER result into the WHF database, we will subsidize \$20 of your cost, so you will only pay \$25. These results will be acquired the day of the test. Additional exam time will be scheduled, if needed, later in the week.

Cardiac Echocardiogram Clinic: Monday April 4th through Friday, April 8th. This clinic will be conducted by Dr. Rebecca Stepien and the cardiology team from University of Wisconsin, Madison. There will be two clinics... the first for dogs already enrolled in the cardiac study and the second for dogs not enrolled in the study where the owners want heart clearances. All exams will take 30 minutes. Please read the following carefully so you know which clinic to sign up for and what the cost is:

- **1. Cardiac Study Recheck Clinic:** This exam is for those dogs already enrolled previously in the cardiac study. The cost of the recheck exam to you is \$50 (the WHF will subsidize the additional \$50 for the full \$100 fee). All dogs over 7 are FREE. When you send in your sign up form, be sure to mark the RECHECK box. All rechecks will be given priority in the cardiac clinic.
- 2. Cardiac Clearance Clinic: This exam is for anyone wanting a pre-breeding or health clearance check on a dog not in the above study. The cost of the exam is \$175. If you are willing to enter both your dog and the echocardiogram result into the WHF database, we will subsidize \$50 of your cost, so you will only pay \$125. These results will be acquired the day of the test. Only one whippet will be allowed per owner to pre-register but more will be accommodated if time and space allow.

**AKC DNA Profile test**: (DNA cheek swab test): \$30/sample, mailed in with all samples following the national. Swabs will be available during the national from Dr. Lisa Costello or you can mail them to her no later than April 15th for submission to AKC as a group. **All swabs must be mailed in TOGETHER to qualify for this special rate...do not send to AKC on your own!** 

Myostatin Deficiency test: (DNA test for the double muscle gene): \$48/sample (\$28 for database participants), mailed in with all samples following the national. Swabs will be available during the national from Dr. Lisa Costello. If you will not be attending the national, the swabs from DDC and payment can be mailed directly to Dr. Costello and will be submitted with all samples following the national specialty (they must be submitted together). These samples must reach her at the address on the health clinic sign up form no later than APRIL 15th, 2011. If you will not be attending the AWC national and need to order sample collection kits directly, call 1-800-625-0874, or email contact@vetdnacenter.com.

**Thyroid Study:** You are invited to have your Whippet donate blood for inclusion in the WHF subsidized Thyroid Hormone Study. The WHF will be collecting blood from healthy whippets throughout the week of the AWC national for the purpose of constructing normal thyroid hormone reference intervals for the breed. We will be working with Dr. MaryDee Sist at the Michigan State University Endocrinology Laboratory. At the conclusion of the study, each participant will receive a full thyroid hormone profile from MSU with interpretations of individual test results. These results will also be archived in the WHF data base for future reference (and therefore made public). This test will be at no cost for dogs who qualify for the study! Study dogs must not be hypothyroid, have health issues, or be on medications that would alter normal thyroid hormone values. You can find the sign-up form on the WHF website: www.whippethealth.org. Please indicate below how many dogs you would like to volunteer for the study and you will be contacted for further information once the health clinic sign up is received.
