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

Take the 2nd left onto 5th St. SE. Take the 1st right onto E Main. Continue to Traffic St., Turn right at Main St. Continue on 60th St. E. Destination will be on right.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS –SEE PUYALLUP/TACOMA PL FOR FULL WEEKEND RULES

- Grounds will be open at Noon and close two (2) hours after the last Specialty ends on Friday.
- No parking on the Fairgrounds. Violators will be towed at the owners' risk and expense.
- Dogs may not be left in the Exhibit Complex or the Pavilion overnight.
- **No grooming or grooming tables of any kind in the exhibition building (ShowPlex).**
- There is absolutely no dumping or dripping of gray water from RVs onto the ground. The appropriate sewer hookup or dump station should be used for all gray (and black) water. Security will enforce the "no dumping" rule. There is a \$500 fine for all/any infractions of this policy.
- The only fresh water available on the grounds will be in the restrooms. Exhibitors are responsible for the water required for the safety and comfort of their dogs. No bathing of dogs on show grounds.
- Speed limit within the Fairgrounds is 5MPH. Anyone exceeding this speed limit will be subject to an Event Show Hearing, and/or escorted off the grounds immediately.
- **If it is necessary to rescue a dog from a parked vehicle on the show grounds or in the parking areas, the club will not be responsible or liable for any damage to the vehicle involved.**
- **These rules will be enforced by the show committee. Failure to comply with these rules will result in charges being brought before the show committee.**
- No Smoking will be allowed or tolerated in any building on the Show Site. Offenders shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$50, and in the event of continued abuse, shall be asked to leave the show premises.
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendations to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, or communicable diseases, and have the appropriate vaccinations.
- Note: No grooming is allowed upstairs in the Pavilion. Reserved grooming spaces are available and day grooming spaces are available in other sections of the building.

Note: All dogs entered in Bred-by-Exhibitor class must be owned or co-owned by any of the breeders of record as of the date of closing of entries for the show. The person handling the dog in this class must be a breeder of record and an owner of record of this dog. In any subsequent classes for which a dog from the Bred-by-Exhibitor class becomes eligible, there are no restrictions as to who may handle.

Non-Regular Classes (Involving single dog entries)

Veteran Dogs Veteran Bitches

A Class for Dogs and a Class for Bitches 7 years of age and older. Entrants in Veterans Class need not be intact. Spayed and Neutered dogs are eligible. Winners of the above classes, if otherwise undefeated, are eligible to compete for Best of Breed

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION: The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs that according to their owners records have completed the requirements for a Championship but whose Championships are unconfirmed. The showing of dogs whose Championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a Championship according to the owner's records.

Non-Regular Classes (involving multiple dog entries)

STUD DOG CLASS: For Stud Dogs and two of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard for its Breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed competition or some other non-regular class.

BROOD BITCH CLASS: For Brood Bitches and two of their Produce. Same rules as Stud Dog.

BRACE CLASS: For two dogs that are similar in appearance, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in brace competition must have at least one common owner. If more than one Brace is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising each Brace must be designated "Brace No.1," "Brace No.2"

NOTE: As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Brace Class is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.

BREED AWARDS

The Washington State Scottish Terrier Club, through the generosity of its Members and Friends offer the following awards. All donors will be acknowledged in the catalog.

AWARD OF MERIT – WSSTC offers a Dark Green Rosette as an Award of Merit after the Best of Breed Competition. The award recognizes (one or more) outstanding champions, excluding those selected for Best of Breed and Best of Opposite Sex. Champions of record are the only recipients of this award. There will be one Award of Merit for up to five Specials and two awards, if there are more than five in the Best of Breed Competition. The presentation of the Award(s) of Merit is at the judge’s discretion and immediately follows the judging of the Best of Breed Competition. They also are awarded a wooden pen.

BLACKBRIAR BEST IN SPECIALTY SHOW AWARD – This revolving trophy is named in honor of Blackbriar Brooke, the winner of Best of Breed at the first Specialty Show held by the Washington State Scottish Terrier Club. It is awarded by members of WSSTC, to the owner(s) of the dog or bitch that wins Best of Breed, at the Annual June Specialty Show only. It recognizes the participating Scottish Terrier that best represents the breed standard and diehard attitude. The carved, hand split cedar serving tray, measuring 12” x 8” x 2”, with display rack, with the Best In Specialty Show winner’s engraved name on a plaque, remains with WSSTC. For permanent possession the Blackbriar Trophy is to be won three times by the same owner(s) but not necessarily with the same dog or at consecutive shows.

BLACKBRIAR BEST IN SHOW MEDALLION – Blackbriar Best In Specialty Show antique-bronzed medallion is offered by the WSSTC each year to owner(s) of the Scottish Terrier that wins the WSSTC Revolving Blackbriar Best in Specialty Show Award.

First through Fourth Prize, all Non-Regular classes – Scottie Coaster.

NOTE: *If necessary, a trophy may be substituted for one of equal or greater value. All trophies must be picked up on the day of the show. None will be mailed.*

SWEEPSTAKES – JUDGE: MS. LINDA SANCHEZ

The Washington State Scottish Terrier Sweepstakes will be open to all Scottish Terriers between the ages of 6 months and 18 months, except those who have finished the requirement for the championship. Professional handlers may only show dogs owned or co-owned by them in the Sweepstakes. All competing puppies, to be eligible, must be entered in a regular class at a regular class fee. The fee for Sweepstakes shall be \$18.00. The entry in sweepstakes must be noted on the official entry form under “additional class.” Sweepstakes classes will be judged before regular classes.

ORDER OF JUDGING

Puppy Dogs, 6-9 months will be judged following Puppy Bitches, 6-9 months. The First and Second Place Dogs and the First and Second Place Bitches will then compete for the four places in the Age Division Run-Off Stakes. Junior Dogs, 9-12 months will be judged following Junior Bitches, 9-12 months. The First and Second Place Dogs and the First and Second Place Bitches will then compete for the four places in the Age Division Run-Off Stakes. Senior Dogs, 12-18 months, followed by Senior Bitches, 12-18 months, will be judged in the same manner. First Place in each Age Division Run-Off Stakes will then compete for Best in Sweepstakes.

BEST IN SWEEPSTAKES

NO PUPPY BORN AFTER DEC. 7, 2012 IS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER SWEEPSTAKES COMPETITION.

DISTRIBUTION OF STAKES

After 35% of entry fees have been deducted for expenses for the Club, the remaining 65% will be divided as follows:

15% Best of Sweepstakes

The remainder will be divided among dogs and bitches in each age class based on the proportion of that particular class to the total entry.

First - 50 %, Second - 25%, Third - 15 %, Fourth - 10%

Unfilled places and unclaimed stakes due to absenteeism will be returned to the Club.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN CLASS: For boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class in a licensed or member show, with competition present in the Novice class. Juniors which according to their records have completed the requirements to compete in the Open class but whose status is unconfirmed by the American Kennel Club are limited to competing in the Open Class for a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the Junior completed the requirements according to their records.

MASTER CLASS: This class will be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won the 10 first place wins in an Open class with competition to be eligible to enter the Limited Class Competition. The calendar for this class will be November 1 - October 31 of the following year.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department, (919) 233-9767. BE SURE ALL INFORMATION for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of entry form. **NOTE: SUBSTITUTION OF DOG IN JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP AT THE SHOW(S): There will be an Administration Fee of \$5.00 charged for any substitution of dog in Junior Showmanship, to be collected at the time of the change.**



DIRECTIONS TO THE PUYALLUP FAIR & EVENTS CENTER



FROM OLYMPIA AND THE SOUTH: Take I-5 North to Hwy. 512, Exit 127. Follow Hwy. 512 east for 10 miles to the Meridian St., S. Exit. Turn left under the freeway. Fairgrounds are on the left.

FROM SEATTLE AND THE NORTH: Take I-5 South to the Puyallup Exit #142B in Federal Way. As exiting, stay in the left lane. Turn right at the traffic light at the end of the exit ramp, then turn left at the first traffic light onto Hwy. 161. Travel approximately eight miles into the Puyallup Valley (Hwy. 161 becomes Meridian St. in Puyallup). Continue south through town. The Fairgrounds will be on your right at 9th Ave. S.W.

FROM BELLEVUE AND EASTSIDE: Take I-90 to I-405 South. Take Exit 2 to Hwy. 167 toward Kent/Auburn. Travel South on Hwy. 167 for approximately 20.2 miles to Hwy. 161 South/Hwy. 512 W. Travel 2.3 miles to the second exit, Meridian St. S. At the light at the end of the exit turn right. Fairgrounds are on the left.

FROM SEATAC AIRPORT:

Option 1: Depart airport, taking exit to I-5 and I-405. Follow signs to I-405 Northbound toward Renton and Bellevue. Take Exit 2, Hwy. 167 South toward Kent/Auburn. Travel south on Hwy. 167 for 20.2 miles to 161 South/512 West. Follow Hwy. 512 West to Puyallup and Olympia, traveling 2.3 miles. Take the second exit, Meridian Street South.
