BEST OF BREED COMPETITION: The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed Competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs that according to their owners records have completed the requirements for a Championship but whose Championships are unconfirmed. The showing of dogs whose Championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a Championship according to the owner's records.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

Veteran Dogs (8 Yrs. & Older) Veteran Bitches I (8 Yrs. & Older)

A class for dogs and a class for bitches born on or before 4/2/1997)

(The winners of these Classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed) *Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that neutered males and spayed bitches may be entered in Veteran Classes.

Herding Titled Dogs Herding Titled Bitches

A Class for Dogs and a Class for Bitches to honor those dogs and bitches who have distinguished themselves in the job for which the Belgian Tervuren was bred. Dogs and bitches are eligible to compete if they have one or more AKC herding titles (HT, PT, HS, HSAd, HSAs, HSAC, HSBd, HSBs, HSBc, HSCs, HI, HIAd, HIAs, HIAC, HIBd, HIBs, HIBc, HICs HX, HXAd, HXAs, HXAc, HXBd, HXBs, HXBc, HXCc, HC) by the close of entries. Herding Instinct Certificates (from the AKC or ABTC) do not meet the eligibility requirements of this class. Entries may be neutered or spayed, and may or may not have a Championship. Winners will be eligible to compete in Best of Breed.

Select Awards – The judge may, at her discretion, recall into the ring approximately 10% of all dogs/bitches eligible for Best of Breed competition, to be awarded Judges Select Rosettes and ABTC Gold Medallions. These awards are reserved for those quality animals the Judge feels are worthy of final consideration for Best of Breed.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

(The winners of these Classes do not become eligible to compete for Best of Breed)

STUD DOG CLASS: For Stud Dogs and two of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of the get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC policy or the standard for its Breed. Get must be entered in a regular class, Best of Breed competition or some other non-regular class. An entry fee of \$22.00 will be charged for the Stud Dog if he is NOT entered in one of the Regular Classes, Non-Regular Classes or for Best of Breed Competition. Entry fee for Stud Dog as an additional class is \$16.00.

BROOD BITCH CLASS: For Brood Bitches and two of their Produce. Same rules as Stud Dog.

BRACE CLASS: For two Belgian Tervuren with identical ownership. This is an additional class only. Both dogs **MUST ALSO BE ENTERED IN ANOTHER CLASS.** Entry Fee for Brace as a UNIT is \$16.00

NOTE: As the judge's decision in the Stud Dog, Brood Bitch and Brace Class is based on the merits of more than one dog/bitch, not one of the dogs/bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won this class.

SWEEPSTAKES

A Sweepstakes will be held in conjunction with this Specialty. Sweepstakes will be judged prior to the Regular Classes. All dogs and bitches entered in Sweepstakes MUST ALSO be entered in a Regular Class at this Specialty, at the regular entry fee. The Sweepstakes is open to all dogs/bitches who are at least 6 months of age and under 18 months of age on the day of the show. Champions of Record at the time that entries close are eligible to compete. No professional handler may show a dog in Sweepstakes unless they own or co-own the dog or are a member of the immediate family of the owner. Entries must be made at the same time and on the same entry form as the regular classes, indicating in the space for "Additional Classes" your entry in Sweepstakes.

VETERAN SWEEPSTAKES

Dogs shown in Veteran Sweepstakes need not be entered in one of the regular classes or at the regular entry fee. Indicate your Veteran Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided. Spayed bitches and neutered dogs are eligible for Veteran Sweepstakes.

Non-Regular Classes: All Non-Regular Obedience Classes will be assigned to the available judge after entries close. Non-Regular Class scores are not eligible for Special Obedience Trial Awards, nor will qualifying scores be awarded AKC legs or points toward Obedience Trial Championships. Refer to AKC Obedience Regulations for a complete definition of each non-regular class.

Veterans Class: The veterans' class will be for dogs that have an obedience title and are at least seven years old on the date of the trial. The exercises will be performed and judged as in the Novice class. Dogs may be entered in a regular obedience class.

Graduate Novice Class: The Graduate Novice class is for dogs that have not been certified by a judge to have received a third qualifying score toward a CDX title prior to the closing of entries. Dogs entered in Graduate Novice may also be entered in one of the Novice or Open classes.

Versatility Class: For dogs that are capable of performing the Utility exercises and that are eligible under these Regulations. Six exercises will be performed: two each from the Novice, Open, and Utility Classes. There will be no Group Exercises. The exercises will be performed and judged as in the regular classes.

Brace Class: For two dogs capable of performing the Novice exercises. A separate entry form must be completed for each dog comprising the Brace with a single entry fee. Indicate class as "Brace – Obedience." See Entry Fees.

Team Class: For any four dogs. A fifth may be entered as an alternate requiring no additional fee. A separate entry form must be completed for each dog with a single unit entry fee for the class. Indicate class as "Team"– Obedience" Please mail Team entries together. See Entry Fees.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC 919-854-0195.

NOVICE CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show. **NOVICE CLASS DIVIDED:** **Junior**-9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show; **Intermediate**-12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show; **Senior**-15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

OPEN CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show, and who have won three first place awards in a Novice Class in a licensed or member show, with competition present. The winner of a Novice Class shall automatically become eligible, upon notice to the Open Class ring steward, to enter and compete in the Open Class at the same show provided the win is the third (3rd) first place award with competition and further providing there are one or more Junior Handlers competing in the Open Class. **OPEN CLASS DIVIDED:** **Junior**-9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show; **Intermediate**-12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show; **Senior**-15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show.

- A short history of the dog in 175 words or less; if you exceed the limit, the editor reserves the right to edit the material submitted or to decrease the size of your picture to enable the text to fit. If possible please also email your text to the appropriate Chair.

Per ABTC Guidelines, the Honor Parade is limited to all Belgian Tervuren eight years of age or older on the date of the Honor Parade and having at least one AKC title or a BAR award. The Honor Parade Committee may review dogs that because of a health crisis or similar situation might not survive to the age to qualify for the Honor Parade. Tervuren entered in Best of Breed eligible conformation classes (class dogs, class bitches, best of breed, non-regular veteran dog and veteran bitch) are not eligible to participate in the Honor Parade. A Show Secretary, Show Chairperson and any Specialty Judge who has completed their assignment may enter their eligible Tervuren in the Honor Parade.

Per ABTC Guidelines, the Rescue Parade is limited to dogs and bitches that have been placed through the ABTC Rescue committee, or other rescue organization. All Rescue dogs shall be altered. Dogs that have been “rehomed,” returned to the breeder and/or through the breeder has found a new home, are not eligible for the Rescue Parade. Rescue dogs are not eligible to compete in any Conformation event at the National, but may be entered in any Performance event as well as the Rescue Parade. There is no age limitation.

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GENERAL INFORMATION AND SHOW RULES
NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

The American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations will govern this Show and Exhibitors must make themselves familiar with the agreement of the American Kennel Club, referred to on the reverse side of the entry blanks that accompany this Show Premium List. Single copies of Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Junior Showmanship Guidelines, Obedience Regulations and Rules Applying to Registration and Discipline may be obtained free from the American Kennel Club, 5580 Centerview Dr., Raleigh, NC 27606-3390.

ALL CLASSES will be scheduled from 7:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m. each day. Consult the judging program for times of judging. Dogs must be present for their scheduled judging time and may be excused as soon as they are no longer needed for competition. Telegraph, telephone and unsigned entries cannot be accepted. Entries not on official AKC forms and photocopies of entries without the Agreement and Rules on the reverse side are NOT ACCEPTABLE.

NO ENTRY shall be made or accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

ENTRIES CANNOT BE ACCEPTED, cancelled, altered or substituted after entries have closed, except as provided for in Ch. 11, Sec.6, AKC rules.

TRANSFER OF ENTRIES: Effective for all shows held on or after July 1, 1980, dogs which according to their owners records have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show, but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one half hour prior to the start of judging. (Ch. 14, Sec. 6, AKC rules)

JUNIOR HANDLERS who win a third Novice Class after closing of entries for a show may transfer their entry from Novice Class to Open Class provided that this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least 1/2 hour prior to the start of any regular conformation judging or one half hour prior to the scheduled start of Junior Showmanship judging at the show, whichever is earlier.

ALL ENTRIES ARE TO BE MAILED with fees to Baray Event Services, P.O. Box 3075, 203 S. 4th Avenue, Sequim, WA 98382. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT FEES (US currency). Acknowledgment of entries will be made as soon as practical. Should such acknowledgment not be received by the exhibitor within a reasonable time, please notify the Superintendent at the above address or phone (360-683-1507) or email dogshows@barayevents.com

ERRORS ON ENTRY BLANKS. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.

IF SAME DOG is entered in more than one class. Highest price class shall be considered first entry.

ENTRY FEES SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge or barred from competition by action of Show Committee. If because of riots, civil disturbances or other acts beyond the control of the management it is impossible to open or to complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.

RETURNED CHECKS do not constitute a valid entry fee. The Club will add \$20.00 to the amount of each returned check. Subsequent returned checks from the same exhibitors may result in being put on a CASH ONLY basis.

DOGS MAY ARRIVE any time prior to scheduled time of judging. Dogs not required for further judging will be excused.

NO DOGS WRONGLY ENTERED in a class may be transferred to another class, except as provided in Ch. 11, Sec. 6, AKC Rules.

ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEASH except when in the Obedience ring.

CHANGES OR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION cannot be made by telephone. Such information must be received in writing or by telegraph prior to the closing of entries as published.

MAKE ALL CANADIAN checks and money orders payable in U.S. Funds.

TROPHIES AND PRIZES will be awarded in the rings to persons exhibiting the dog. No awards will be mailed. The Club reserve the right to make prize substitutions of equal or greater value in the event a specific listed prize is not available.

ADDITIONAL SHOW INFORMATION

- Obedience, Sweepstakes and Conformation will take place on the Tennis Courts. In order to protect the surface, there will be no black soled shoes or canopies allowed. During Obedience, crating will be allowed in designated areas only.
- Look for additional restrictions that will be posted.
- The Show Committee may make and enforce any rules they deem necessary, to insure the continuity of the show and the good will of the hotel.
- The club reserves the right to substitute a prize of equal or greater value.
- All trophies must be claimed the day of the show – none will be mailed.

DO YOU PLAN ON FLYING TO THE 2005 NATIONAL SPECIALTY?

The American Kennel Club is offering two opportunities to save on airfare when flying to AKC events on United Airlines.

ROUTES TO THE SHOW

From the North – South on I-5, exit 205 West, merges with 580 West, Exit 680 South, Exit 237 West, exit Great America Parkway, go south (left turn) 1.7 miles to Mission College Blvd., turn left. The first right is the entry to the Santa Clara Marriott.

From the South – North on I-5, exit directly onto 580 West and then follow directions above.

From San Francisco Airport – Hwy 101 South toward San Jose, go about 28 miles, exit at Bowers Ave/Great America Parkway, left onto Great America Parkway, less than 1 mile, turn right on Mission College Blvd. The first right is the entry to the Santa Clara Marriott.

From San Jose Airport – Exit airport, turn left on Guadalupe Parkway (Hwy 87), Take Hwy 87 to Hwy 101 North, exit Great America Parkway, turn right on Great America Parkway, turn right on Mission College Blvd. The first right is the entry to the Santa Clara Marriott.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS
POLICY ON STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR BY ABTC MEMBERS
ATTENDING NATIONAL (AND OTHER) SPECIALTY SHOWS

The ABTC has an excellent history of maintaining its Specialty headquarters and show site in good condition. Rings, grooming areas and hotel rooms occupied by its members are expected to be left with no appreciable damage and as clean as possible, after the Specialty is over. As a measure of insuring that this standard will be met, the Club, as a matter of policy sets forth the following standards of behavior:

- No dog should be left uncrated in a hotel room in the absence of the room occupants at any time.
- Dogs that constitute a nuisance to other occupants of the hotel by continual barking or howling, may subject their owners to being removed by the hotel.
- There will be no extensive grooming of dogs in the hotel rooms. Grooming will be permitted only in the areas set aside for that purpose.
- No dogs should be washed in hotel bathtubs, and hotel towels should not be used on dogs for drying them or any other purpose.
- The external and internal premises of the hotel and show site shall be kept free of debris and feces caused by the presence of dogs attending the Specialty.
- The Club will provide a committee to inspect rooms upon member checkout, either separately from, or in concert with, designated members from the hotel staff. Should any room or its contents exhibit signs of unusual wear or damage because of the presence of a dog or dogs, the occupant of that room may be held up to censure by the Club and shall recompense the hotel for all damages. Offenders may be censured, held in suspension of membership or expelled from membership in the ABTC should the circumstances warrant.

While the ABTC cannot assume legal responsibility for the actions of individual persons attending one of its national specialties, it assumes ethical responsibility for their actions. It will make every effort to assure that any offending person make redress to the hotel or show site in the event that he/she is responsible for damage to the premises. The ABTC urges its members to carefully inspect their rooms prior to checkout. All National Specialty Attendees are expected to adhere to these Standards.

The Specialty Committee additionally requires that:

- Exhibitors are not to bring litters of puppies to the Show Headquarters.
- Non-ABTC members attending the 2005 ABTC National Specialty will adhere to these standards.
- All dogs will be on a leash at all times.
- By exhibiting at the National Specialty, you are agreeing to abide by the rules established by the show committee and the host hotel. Failure to follow these rules will result in removal from the host hotel.

Exhibitors are required to report any changes/corrections after closing directly to the American Kennel Club.
